### Meeting minutes

### Paper Agenda item

### 1 Chair's report

- Brian Wesley and Matt Cooper (Moolarben Coal) presented on silica dust.
- Peter Day acted as meeting Chair in lieu of the Hon. George Souris AM and thanked Moolarben Coal for the presentation and for hosting the meeting.
- The formal meeting commenced at 12.21 p.m. with an Acknowledgement of Country. The Chair welcomed the reappointment of Ian Cribb and new appointment of Kylie Harris as council members.

### 2 Declaration of interests

- Prof. Deborah Yates, Robin Williams and Graeme Osborne requested minor amendments to their declarations.
- Regarding *Paper 4 Correspondence* an MSAC member disclosed they had previously used software developed by Dr Mark Colewell.

### **Outcomes**

• MSAC noted the member's past use of software regarding Paper 4 - Correspondence.

## 3 Acceptance of previous minutes and actions

## 4 Correspondence

### **Outcomes**

 MSAC noted the correspondence since the last meeting and agreed to consider Dr Colewell's correspondence as Additional Business (see minutes for Paper 14 below).

### 5 Review of the coal worker health surveillance scheme

- Wayne Green from Coal Services addressed MSAC regarding the progress of recommendations from the review of the Coal Industry Health Surveillance Scheme (CIHSS):
  - Coal Services is targeting 1 July 2024 implementation for the new respiratory disease thresholds subject to further meetings of the working group with respiratory physicians
  - If the Queensland respiratory disease inhalable dust threshold is adopted most underground coal sites will have difficulty accommodating the affected group of workers. Around 300 to 350 (5%)workers out of 8000 medicals performed per year may not be able to be returned to work at underground sites at that threshold
  - Different sampling methods are being considered due to cross contamination (dust on clothes etc), with the view of affecting the accuracy of inhalable dust samples
  - In process of introducing complex lung testing 2 units have been procured and 2 are in progress. Nurses are being trained, with view that testing will start from July 2024
  - Coal Services is going out to tender for new software, but has separate controls in place currently
  - The final dates for implementation are linked into the order 43 work. The draft audit is currently out for consultation across stakeholder groups. After final feedback is received regarding impact assessment a further report will be made to MSAC.
- It was suggested that inclusion of SEG rates by Coal Services in table 1 may be of assistance.

### Work plan to support Strategic Plan to 2026

The MSAC noted the proposed timeline for Strategic Plan projects:

- Monitoring progress of CIHSS:
  - Timeframes for outstanding items to be confirmed in Quarter 2 2024 (see Action D in Paper 5 above)
- Monitoring progress of airborne contaminant framework workplace exposure standards:
  - SafeWork Australia is coordinating the process with key stakeholder groups including ACTU, Minerals Council of Australia and SafeWork NSW. The Resources Regulator reminded MSAC stakeholder representatives to liaise with their national counterparts on this issue.
- Reporting culture survey:
  - Paper for September 2024 MSAC meeting:
    - review outcomes from last survey
    - scoping for new survey including proposed audience and whether a contractor will be engaged to implement the survey
  - Paper for December 2024 MSAC meeting:
    - survey implementation proposal for 2025.
- Resources Regulator's reporting to inform future priorities of MSAC and standing agenda items will continue
- Adverse Vehicle Interaction Advisory Committee (AVIAC):
  - First meeting has been held. Next meeting scheduled for 26 March 2024.
  - Progress update to be provided for June 2024 MSAC meeting.
- Identifying actions to reduce incidence of musculoskeletal injuries
  - input from MSAC will be required to inform the scope of this project.

### **Outcomes**

• The MSAC endorsed the workplan to support the Strategic Plan to 2026, noting that the timeframes and projects are flexible and may be updated as issues emerge or change.

## 7 Amendments to welding fumes exposure standard

In January 2024 Safe Work Australia changed the workplace exposure standard (WES) for welding fumes from an 8-hour time weighted average (TWA) of 5 mg/m<sup>3</sup> to 1 mg/m<sup>3</sup>.

#### **Outcomes**

- Members noted the change to the WES for welding fumes from 5 mg/m³ to 1 mg/m³.
- Members noted that the Resources Regulator will take an education and information approach to help duty holders comply with the standard, including any action required to achieve compliance.

## 8 Member updates

- It was suggested that a topic of interest be presented at each meeting, with possibly a Mates in Mining presentation for the next meeting.
- Coal Services tabled its member update report and noted:
  - Data on dust surveillance is indicating:
    - improvements for continuous miner workers, underground outbye workers and underground cement and spraying workers
    - increased levels of exposure for surface blast crew and surface drillers
  - Injury notifications remain stable noting that there is a 48-hour reporting requirement as compared to 10 days for the Resources Regulator.
  - At the end of calendar year 2023, 211 coal workers were identified with health conditions that required a restriction on employment until further investigation.
     There were 173 dust restrictions issued (168 in open cut).
  - There were an additional 19 cardiovascular risk determinations that required restrictions on work until further investigations (18 open cut and 1 underground).
  - There has been a small increase in hit by moving objects as a mechanism of injury (e.g. hammers, drills, hoses in the underground environment).

#### **Outcomes**

- Members noted the report tabled by Coal Services.
- Members agreed that a short presentation be included on a relevant topic at future meetings and that subject to availability. The Mates in Mining presentation should be scheduled for the next meeting.

#### **Actions**

I. Secretariat to liaise with the Mining and Energy Union regarding a Mates in Mining presentation is able to be arranged for the June 2024 MSAC meeting.

### 9 National Dust Disease Task Force

- The Commonwealth Government has passed <u>National Occupational Respiratory</u> Disease Registry Act 2023 and committed to it being operative in 6 months.
- The Lung Foundation Australia:
  - is establishing a national research network
  - held a consumer research forum on silicosis in November with further forums planned this year.

Prof. Deborah Yates advised that the Lung Foundation Australia would welcome mining industry input into its endeavours.

### **Outcomes**

Members agreed to maintain a watching brief regarding the draft 2023 – 2028
 National Silicosis Prevention Strategy and associated National Action Plan.

## 10 Legislative framework update

- The NSW industrial relations commission is being re-established.
- Consultation on the proposed NSW industrial manslaughter legislation closed on 18 March 2024.
- A ban on the use of engineered stone in NSW will commence on 1 July 2024.
- SafeWork NSW is undertaking targeted consultation on ammonium nitrate changes to separation distances. The Resources Regulator recommended that mining union stakeholder representatives liaise with Industry Safety and Health Representatives to ensure they are aware of the consultation process.

### **Outcomes**

Members noted the legislative framework update.

## 11 NSW Resources Regulator quarterly report

- The Resources Regulator has produced a video on sexual harassment psychosocial issues.
- The Resources Regulator tabled the quarterly safety report for October to December 2023.

### **Outcomes**

Members noted the Quarterly safety report – October to December 2023.

## 12 Mine safety levy report

### 14 Additional business

- Secretariat to circulate Mental Awareness, Respect and Safety (MARS) Program insights from WA worker survey and interviews to MSAC members out of session.
- The NSW Government has responded to Portfolio Committee No. 2's report into the current and potential impacts of gold, silver, lead and zinc mining on human health, land, air and water quality in New South Wales.
  - The inquiry looked at a range of factors regarding metal mining and recommended that the Resources Regulator be resourced adequately regarding non-coal mines.

- The NSW government response advised that the Regulator is fully resourced and regularly reviews requirements and reports, informs MSAC and engages with industry.
- The Resources Regulator is reviewing:
  - the Independent Review of SafeWork NSW by the Hon Robert McDougall KC
  - the Audit Office's report into the Effectiveness of SafeWork NSW in exercising its compliance functions

to determine whether there are any actions for the Regulator to consider. If any actions arise for MSAC to consider, then a paper will be prepared.

- Dr Mark Colwell has written to the MSAC and to the Mining and Petroleum Competence Board (MPCB) seeking a range of prohibitions around strata and mines and the introduction of a geotechnical engineer statutory function.
  - Regarding the requested prohibitions, the Resources Regulator's approach is risk based and supported by analysis
  - Regarding the geotechnical engineer statutory function, the MPCB previously considered this in 2019/20 and after consultation on a discussion paper, determined that it was not warranted. The MPCB proposes to consider Dr Colwell's correspondence at its next meeting in May 2024.

### **Outcomes**

 MSAC has the role of advising the Minister generally regarding work health and safety issues in the mining industry in NSW. However the MPCB has the specific function of advising both the Minister and the NSW Resources Regulator regarding required competencies for statutory functions in NSW. Members also noted that the Resource Regulator's approach to regulating the management of hazards in the mining industry is risk based.

- K.
